WORLD'S GREATEST WILDFLOWER DISPLAY NOW STARTING

Mulla Mulla, Mt Augustus.



With some of the best rains in years in the Gascoyne-Murchison the biggest wildflower show on earth is about to begin. Along the way, travel the extraordinary Gascoyne-Murchison Outback Pathways self drive trails, meet friendly characters and experience the unique heart of Western Australia's Outback.

Depart Perth and drive to Wongan Hills and Dalwallinu for stunning wildflower displays including hakea and wattle. Be sure to visit the Western Wildflower Farm at Watheroo. See stunning wreath flowers around Pindar Guesthouse.

Rock. White everlastings now making an appearance between Sandstone and Mt Magnet. Outback accommodation in the area includes Nallan Station, Cue's restored Queen of the Murchison, Miners Rest, Windinong, Wogarno, Meeline and Kirralocka Stations.

Hit the road to adventure and travel the Wool Wagon Pathway encompassing Wooleen Station, Murchison Settlement, Bidgemia Station and Gascoyne Junction. Everlastings are now starting to bloom along some parts of this route.

Return to Perth via Paynes Find (this year celebrating its centennial) and perhaps Ninghan Station.

Travel onto the Kingsford Smith Mail Run to Kennedy Range National Park then onto Mt Augustus with its displays of purple mulla mulla. Experience true outback hospitality at Cobra Bangemall Inn or Mt Augustus Tourist Park.

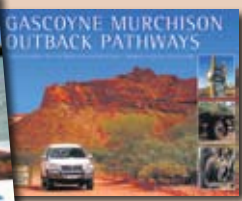
Continue south past Mt Gould Lockup ruins to historic Meekatharra with its many natural and man made attractions. While here see the mulla mulla and wattles.
